LETTER FROM THE YLN ADMINISTRATOR

Greetings! I have been the Assistant Director for the Library District since May of 2023, and it is my pleasure to address the membership of the Yavapai Library Network in this Annual Report. Even though I was in this position for only 1.5 months of FY 2022-23, I was the YLN Cataloger for the previous 3.5 years. As the YLN Cataloger I served the entire membership, and I am glad that I can continue to do so as the YLN Administrator.

Some of the noteworthy changes and happenings that took place in 2022-23 include:

- Valerie Burns, former YCFLD Assistant Director and YLN Library Network Manager, retired in December 2022. During her tenure, she led the YLN through the pandemic years and successfully oversaw the addition of 15 libraries to the Network. Her unwavering guidance and dedication will be missed.
- The circulation of physical materials rebounded after the 2019-20 dip, while the demand for digital materials not only remained strong but continued to increase.
- Usage of Sora, Overdrive's K-12 platform, exploded in 2022-23 and will likely remain strong as students seem to have really taken to e-books and e-audiobooks.
- Ash Fork Unified School District and Seligman Unified School District initiated the circulation of their materials, which were cataloged at the Library District office.
- Del Rio Elementary School and Heritage Middle School, both part of Chino Valley Unified School District, rejoined the YLN, providing 32,445 volumes to the Network.
- Park View/Canyon View ceased operations and withdrew from the YLN.
- The transition to the Aspen app was successfully completed.
- WorkFlows, our integrated library system (ILS) client, migrated to the cloud.
- A search committee for a new ILS met throughout the year to develop specifications and assess bids.
- The YLN portal underwent a redesign.
- Unique (MessageBee) was introduced to the YLN, enabling voice notifications in addition to email.

The year 2023-24 is expected to be very busy for the Yavapai Library Network. First, there will be a new integrated library system, Koha from ByWater, to be implemented. The Steering Committee will review our Strategic Plan, and the Technology User Group will update the Technology Plan. Furthermore, all YLN member agreements will expire at the end of June 2024, meaning that they will all need to be renewed. Get ready for an "all hands on deck" year, with plenty of opportunities for everyone to contribute!

ABOUT THE YLN

The Yavapai Library Network is a collaboration of 59 public, academic, K-12, and museum libraries situated throughout Yavapai County, Arizona. The YLN facilitates the sharing of materials and resources between libraries, enabling even people in remote areas access to an extensive collection of over 1 million items.

The Yavapai Library Network was initially founded in 1985, through a collaboration between the Yavapai College Library and the Prescott Public Library. Over the years, the Yavapai Library Network has grown significantly and now encompasses 59 libraries, including academic, public, K-12, and special/museum libraries. The YLN also includes six special collections.






Percent Change in Overdrive/Libby + Sora Circulation (FY22 to FY23)





Total Circulation









BUDGET AND ASSESSMENT

FY 2022-23



The current level of funding budgeted for YLN operations is \$852,934. This includes staffing, maintenance, subscription fees, fees associated with the sorting facility, and all other expenses. All YLN staff are now consolidated in the wages/benefits column of the above chart.

The YLN budget is fully funded by the Yavapai County Free Library District, and is separate from the reserve fund.

ASSESSMENT FORMULA

A reserve fund was established to ensure that YLN members enjoy leading-edge technology. The membership is billed \$200,000 annually to help support this fund.

The reserve fund rolls over from year-to-year ensuring funds are available for a large reserve expenditure related to technology. Replenishing the reserve fund is the only fee that membership is currently charged on an annual basis. As of June 30, 2023, this fund's balance was \$514,126. Each library's portion of this bill is determined by this detailed assessment formula.

CORE ACCESS 25%

A base amount is assessed that is the same for every library. This ensures the larger libraries are not unfairly subsidizing the smaller libraries. This functional area covers basic access to the integrated library system.

STAFF 20%

The number of people accessing the integrated library system also places a burden on resources. This billing amount is determined by the number of paid staff, volunteers, and student workers performing staff functions in this system.

ITEMS/LIBRARY USERS 10%

The final functional area deals with maintaining and storing data. The number of items and the number of library users all take up space on the system. Storage space is inexpensive, which is why this functional area is the smallest percentage.

TRANSITS 25%

A major expense of the YLN is the cost of transporting materials from library to library. The formula's transit fee is based on the number of items borrowed by each library, not the number of items loaned.

CIRCULATION/HOLDS 20%

The library user activity also contributes considerably to system use. The biggest portion of library user activity is circulation with the second largest portion consisting of holds. Libraries that circulate more items to their patrons pay a higher percentage of this functional area.



The configuration of these functional areas ensures that no single library pays more or less than its fair share. The amount billed to each member is on the next page.
